Ballad Health restricts visitation

Effective Saturday, March 21, Ballad Health will no longer allow visitors in our inpatient hospital units, long-term care facilities or behavioral health centers. Exceptions to this policy include labor and delivery units, which will allow one visitor per room. The neonatal intensive care unit at Niswonger Children's Hospital, as well as rooms with pediatric patients, will allow two visitors, but they must be the patient's parents or guardians.

An update on non-emergent surgical procedures

Upon consultation with the local medical community, Ballad Health agrees with guidance from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the American College of Radiology, and the State of Tennessee, which recommend hospitals postpone non-emergent procedural cases and outpatient diagnostic procedures. Based on the recommendations, we will follow the <u>COVID-19</u>: <u>Guidance for Triage of Non-Emergent Surgical Procedures</u> published by the American College of Surgeons on March 17. Prior to visiting the hospital for a previously scheduled procedure, please call your doctor's office directly to receive guidance on whether it has been postponed.
